 - Tier 2: need some check in or additional supports
 - Tier 3: 1:1 tele-counselling
- Referral forms for Tiers 2&3
- Training with all staff; new crisis protocol; new consent forms
- Very successful
- Counselors developed social emotional learning lessons
- Mental Health Resources Button on SMCPS & school webpages
- More domestic violence issues have popped up
- Predicting increase in needs when everyone returns to school
- Currently planning for all scenarios for fall
- First year finishing up with social workers in schools! Funding for year 2 to continue having social workers!!

 inpatient treatment center is doing well; Closed on second property shooting for November opening; seeking
 location for women's inpatient treatment center; trouble finding housing for those transitioning back into communities;
 case workers completing trainings to be able to accept PRP referrals for minors

 Beacon of Hope consistent with Governor's order looking to do this Monday; soft reopening of in-person groups
