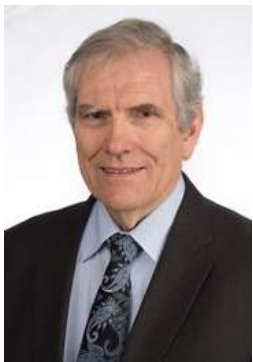
This session will focus on the impact of traumatic events and adverse childhood experiences on behavioral health and highlight family-informed trauma interventions.
