Academic Detailing

What is it?

How does it work?

- Academic detailing is a 1-on-1 outreach education technique that helps clinicians provide evidence-based care to their patients.
 - A successful AD is highly interactive, and continually assesses clinicians' needs to promote better *prescribing, screening, and patient education.*

Academic Detailing

What It Is

How does it work

- Academic detailing provides clinicians with data about the effectiveness, safety, and cost of current treatments.
 - Clinicians have competing demands for their time.
 - As a result, many clinicians are unaware of the alternatives that exist for prescribing, prevention, screening, and patient education.

How does Academic Detailing work?

- Prevention staff are trained by the National Resource Center for Academic Detailing (NaRCAD)
 - The Prevention staff schedule field visits with primary care physicians within St. Mary's County
 - Field visits involve discussion related to lowering doses of pain medications and alternatives to narcotics for pain management

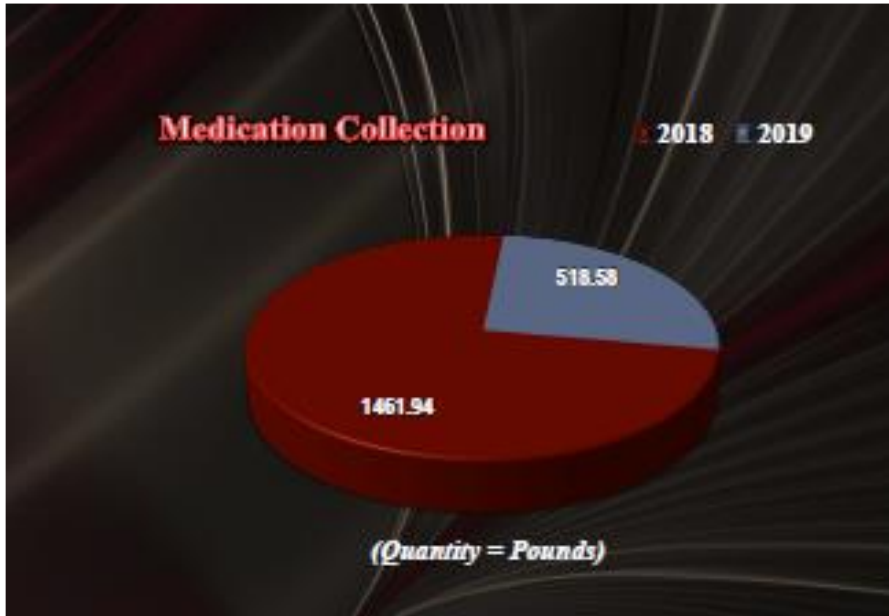

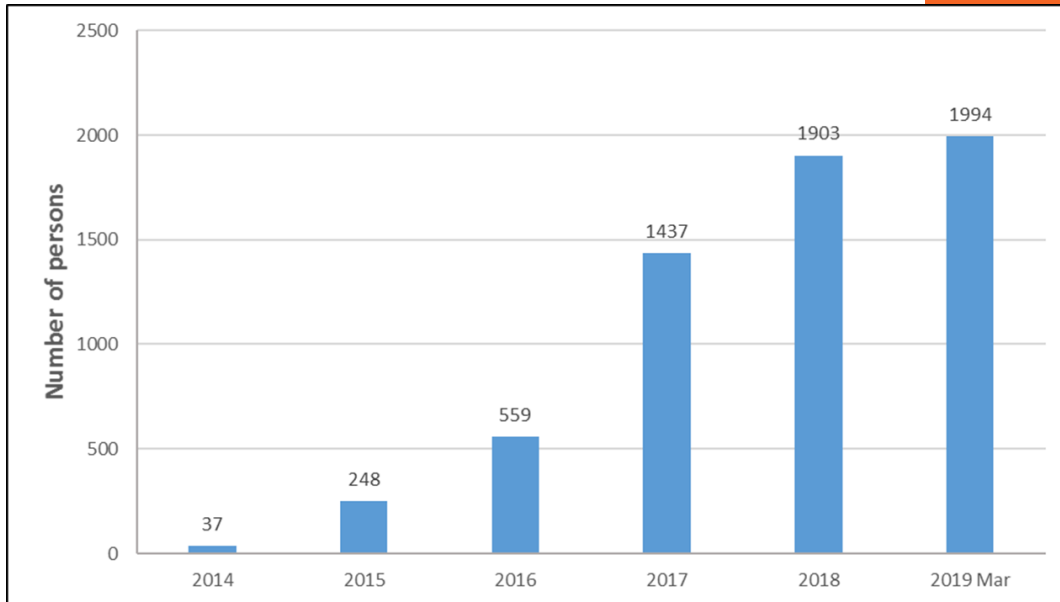

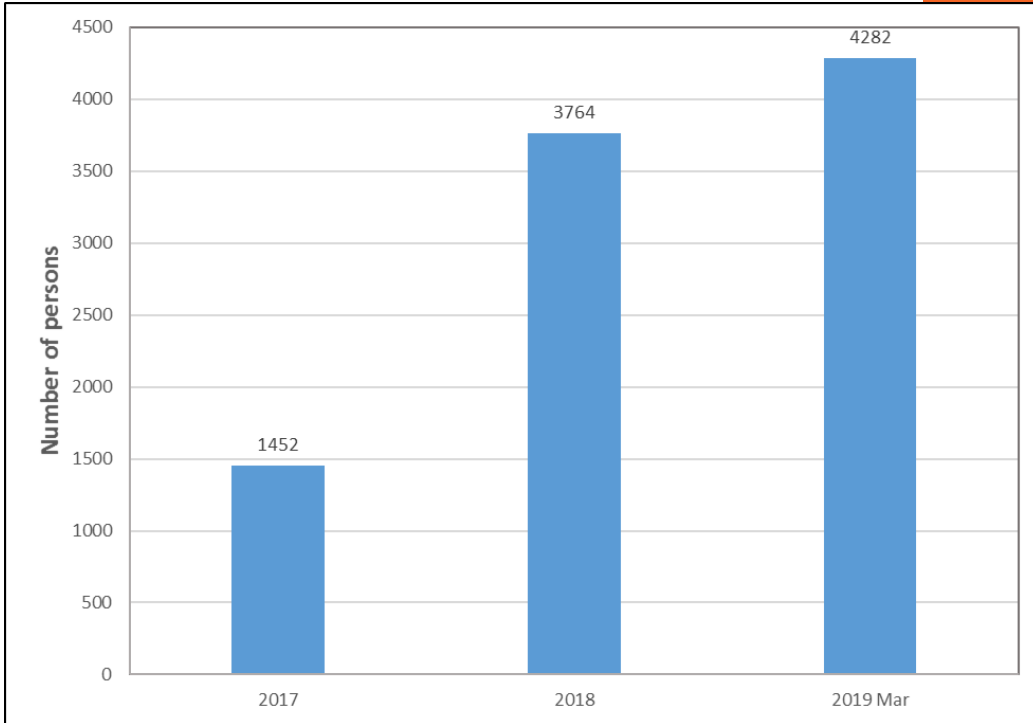

- Round 1 (Jan – Feb) 98 establishments, 91% pass rate
- Round 2 (March) 101 establishments, 78% pass rate
- Round 3 (April) 27 of the failed establishments were visited and produced a 93% pass rate
- Round 4 (May) 199 establishments 84% pass rate
- Round 5 (May) 29 of the failed establishments were visited and produced a 93% pass rate

Social Host Ordinance

Statistics

Percentage of SMC high school students using alcohol

- 33% drank alcohol in the past 30 days
- 19% had their first drink prior to age 15 years old
- 18% engaged in binge drinking

Statistics

Where SMC Youth Use & Obtain Alcohol

Use

- 90% at a party
- 82% at a friend's house
- 58% at home
- 11% at a community event
- 7% at school

Obtain

- 65% take alcohol from home
- 61% paid an adult
- 52% from a non-related adult
- 11% purchased it themselves

Current Law - St. Mary's County



- It is illegal in Maryland to furnish alcohol to a minor.
- Violation is a misdemeanor (**criminal penalty**)

Social Host Ordinance - proposed

A **Local Social Host Ordinance** can hold individuals responsible for hosting or permitting a party on private property where persons under 21 years of age possess or consume alcohol, regardless of who supplied the alcohol.

How a Social Host Ordinance Works



Allows law enforcement to write **civil citations**, similar to traffic tickets, to the property owners



Levy a fine for a first offense with fines increasing in severity for subsequent offenses at the same location



Can enable local governments **to recover costs** for repeated law enforcement or other emergency service responses to a property

Block Grant Services

Student Prevention Program

- Began 2016-17 SY
- Works with students in crisis or in need of behavioral health intervention
- The program has seen more than 1,607 students
- All middle and high schools will not have mental health counselors

Block Grant Services

R U OK? Suicide Prevention



- Began 2018-19 SY
- Brings awareness to signs & symptoms, resources
- Outreach conducted in all high schools including St. Mary's Ryken
- Media campaign, billboards, Comcast, geofencing & promotional products

Block Grant Services

Conscious Discipline &
Wise Owl Programs



- Social emotion regulation for Pre k students
- Training for Pre K teachers, classroom aids and parent workshops
- Classroom implementation with Best Buddies Program
- Wise Owl used primarily during Red Ribbon week for elementary students
