Awareness of Resources

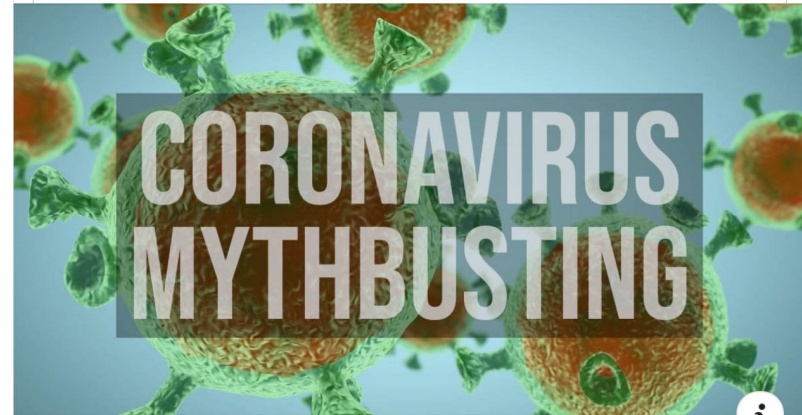
- COVID-19 Resource Guide

 - Handed out by providers as needed
 - Posted on Hispanic Facebook page (6 likes/comments)
 - Posted on the HSMP website (no known interaction)
 - Discussion around in-person being the best method and then housed online
- COVID-19 Facebook Quiz

 - When posted on HSMP Facebook 11/19: 0 interaction
 - When posted on my personal Facebook 11/22: 4 responses
 - Accuracy averaging 92%
 - Some reported not initially seeing the option of All of the Above on the symptoms question
 - One person got the CO2 intoxication and glove questions wrong
 - Demographics
 - 3 other counties in Maryland, 1 in Tennessee
 - Usual interaction is within a few days due to Facebook algorithm

Recommendations for Outreach during COVID-19

- Providers are an effective method of handing out targeted information since they are still meeting (even if they are meeting virtually)
- Getting out information through the schools could be an effective way to reach families, but it is important to respect their processes for information distribution.
- Facebook content is only productive if it is on an active page. It is good for social awareness or reminders, but not necessarily education.
- Handing out information at testing sites and drive-by outreach events gets the information out, but there is no way to track effectiveness.
- If posting it on websites, it is important to use a website that reaches the target population and is easily visible.
- Simple radio spotlights are effective in the Hispanic community if there's funding

6. Participated in community on foot blitz leading to creation of Spanish-language resource guide.
