### Reduce ED Visits

- The Family Education Subcommittee updates
  - The subcommittee last met August 2.
  - Next steps: developing a landing page and print out of the compiled parent resources, reviewing successful models or best practices of delivering parent/family education, and more!
  - Discussion on the lack of access to schools for public health outreach. Previously it was easy for SMCHD to share information at the schools, but it's become more difficult to gain access to students/parents.

- Mental Health Court Subcommittee updates
  - The subcommittee last met on August 3.
  - Next steps: Reaching out to counties in Maryland and other states for information on how their MHC courts were established, reviewing alternative routes such as veterans, re-entry or drug courts, reaching out to State's Attorney office, judges, continuing to request data, and more!

### No Shows

- The <u>Client Letter For Providers</u> template will be sent to SMCHD's Language Services to be translated into Spanish, pending review.
- Transportation Advisory Committee met on July 20 and shared the <u>results</u> of its survey. View the presentation slides <u>here</u>. Findings include:
  - STS is the most used form of public transportation in the county
  - There is a great demand for expanding existing STS routes by extending the hours of operation and reaching citizens in more remote parts of the county.
  - Many citizens are unaware of the transportation services available to them and would benefit from greater advertisement.
- <u>SMCHD's Medical Assistance Transportation Program</u> provided numbers on no-shows for all trips for Fiscal Year 2023
  - There was a total of 9,389 trips, with 63 No Shows for SMCHD that they are able to track.
    - There are strict stipulations for individuals who no-show for a ride. This could suggest the reason for a low no-show percentage across the year.

#### CONTACT

If you or a loved one is experiencing a crisis, contact our crisis number: (301) 900-HELP



#### DISPATCH

An experienced dispatcher will answer your call and gather information regarding the incident.



#### **ASSESSMENT**

Depending on the situation, you may receive immediate phone resolution, or our Mobile Response Team will be dispatched to your location within 45-60 minutes.



#### INTERVENTION

Once we arrive, we will provide interventions best fit for your crisis. This can include de-escalation, safety planning, hospitalization, or resource linkage.



#### FOLLOW-UP

In addition, we will check in with you after a couple days as part of our post-crisis care plan.


