 - Department of Juvenile Services' <u>report</u> on arrests.
 - St. Mary's County Teen Court's <u>report</u> on referrals, participation and completion.
 - The Local Management Board (LMB)
 - SMCSO's <u>Firearm Related Offences</u> Report
