She provides oversight to the VIT programs including the Mentoring Connections Program and the Group Violence Intervention Program. Her expertise and diverse experiences have influenced her commitment to addressing the social determinants of health which impacts community well-being. # 2024 Brainstorming


- In February, we identified **intimate partner violence** and **accidental injuries** as topics that action team members were passionate about.
- Team members were split into two breakout rooms and brainstormed further to come up with the following initiatives:
  - Intimate partner violence
    - Partnering with crisis or mobile response services, hosting a drive, assembling goody bags for victims of abuse
  - Accidental injuries
    - Focusing on education around driver safety (distracted /drunk driving, traffic accidents), fire safety (winter and summer), and water safety.
