 Annie Carter, J.D., Staff Attorney for the Legal Resource Center for Public Health Policy – Cannabis, at the UMD School of Law <u>presented</u> on the LRC-Cannabis Team, their services, and reviewed the data findings for St. Mary's County.

	Greatest challenges : Lack of sufficient funding, lowered risk perception for cannabis, lack of research on risks.

VIT Action Bags - Unhoused Care

- HSMP followed up with the following partners for donation items:
 - Unstoppable You! Ministries dropped off toiletries and other items for the bags.
 - Socks have already been given out to the community for the fiscal year, so the Sheriff's Dept. is out
 of stock.
 - Need: Gender neutral body wipes Michelle, NEW socks (in package)
 - HSMP is hosting a New Sock Drive from 9/5-9/21. Share the flyer and drop off donations of new socks in packaging at SMCHD!
- VIT and emergency dental program, emergency preparedness kits, and more in pre-stuffed clear tote bags with oral care, flashlight keychains, sunblock hand sanitizer, deodorant wipes, and more!
 - HSMP adding universal chargers, deet-free bug spray, reusable hand warmers, and sunglasses.
 - We have not heard back from our other partners.
 - Community Assistance Day has moved to October.
 - 50 for men, 50 for women to include feminine hygiene products from the HSMP Period Equity Drive!

VIT Action Bags - Trauma Kits

- 25 bags provided by SMCFA in advance to stuff for their event with clothing!
 - Distribute to partners who provide PERK exams MedStar St. Mary's Hospital, St. Mary's College of Maryland Wellness Ctr.
 - Blanket, tshirt, sweatpants, water bottle, and other safety needs
 - HSMP has 25 universal chargers for the trauma care bags (court-house drop-off with Taylor)
 - An additional 25 HSMP chargers being used for hotel sheltering/hotline users care bags.

FEVER - VOMITING - DIARRHEA - PINK EYE

FEVER

If my temperature goes above 100°F (37.8°C, I need to stay at home. If I haven't taken fever-reducing medication (For example: Motrin, Tylenol) for 24 hours and I am fever free, I can return to school







STOMACH SYMPTOMS

If I am throwing up or have diarrhea, I need to stay at home. I can return to school after not experiencing these symptoms for 24 hours without medications to control these symptoms.

PINK EYE

Keep me at home if my eye(s) are pink and draining. I can go back to school after the draining has stopped.

If you have questions about whether or not I am too sick for school, call my school nurse.
